Thank you for helping us make this transition smooth and sustainable.




Council met on August 13, at 7:00 pm to review reports and conduct new business.

Treasurer Barry Critchfield reported that contributions are approximately \$10,000 less than this time last year. Council also is looking to reduce the bulk mailing of the Vine Street Journal to conserve costs and paper.

Council is looking for voting members to attend this year's Synod Assembly. As of this printing, there is still a need for one additional voting member. The assembly will be held October 31 and November 1. The assembly will potentially be electing a new bishop at this year's assembly. The Property committee reports that the plaster in the sanctuary is finally becoming dry enough to allow the Elias painters to complete the project. The organ console is now being refurbished, and the goal is to have it completed by the first week of Advent.

SNACKS FOR SENIORS



- Individual bags of fruit snacks.


Items will be collected in the lounge and in the social hall. Join us on **God's Work our Hands Sunday, September** 7th to help sort the items and also make LWR school kits.

ORGAN PROJECT UPDATE

Organ Console Update

Sunday services will return to the sanctuary on September 7. Those in attendance will be very aware of the gaping hole in the choir loft wall and that the organ console has been removed. It took most of an entire week for Mark Steiner and his crew to disassemble the organ console and a number of related components. The collection of parts was moved to the Steiner workshop in Cumberland, MD. At the workshop the console will be refurbished and electronically updated. The work is tedious as every key and every stop will be adapted to solid state electronic action.

One question that I have heard concerns the organ pipes. The pipes will play as they always have. We will still have one of the finest pipe organs in Johnstown. The work being done concerns the console where the organist sits, the keyboards, drawknobs, and the combination action. If you have questions about the organ project, please ask. I enjoy the opportunity to explain our special instrument.
