# A message from Vicar Christy...

"We are saved by faith alone, but the faith that saves is never alone." Martin Luther

Once again, we enter the season of Fall—a time of change. The leaves begin their vibrant transformation into hues of red, orange, and gold. The air turns a little cooler, stirring in us a desire for cozy evenings by the fire, warm mountain pies, and maybe even a few s'mores.

Recently, I had the opportunity to spend three days at Camp Sequanota for the Bishop's Convocation. It was a gift to be immersed in nature—in God's creation. Walking through the woods, sharing conversations with colleagues, it was a time of reflection and renewal.

But even in these moments of peace, I am reminded of those who do not share the same comforts many of us enjoy: a roof over their heads, a warm bed, or even a place at the table to share a meal.

At Churchwide Assembly, we learned about many organizations doing powerful work to care for those in need—both here and around the world. As part of the ELCA, we are blessed with a network of partner ministries that respond when people are hurting, including when we ourselves are in need.

One of those partner ministries is ELCA World Hunger. Nearly 1 in 10 people globally, 733 million—suffer from hunger. ELCA World Hunger responds by working through congregations in the U.S., Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and global partners to address the root causes of hunger and poverty.

The challenge is great. Around 700 million people live in extreme poverty worldwide. In the U.S. alone, 18 million people face food insecurity. Rising housing costs and the effects of climate change only deepen these hardships. Yet we've also seen what can make a difference, like the temporary expansion of the Child Tax Credit during the pandemic, which showed how effective advocacy can reduce poverty.


So, as we move deeper into this season of reflection and gratitude, let's also roll up our sleeves. Let's continue to walk alongside our neighbors in need—through prayer, partnership, and service. We are the hands and feet of Christ in this world. Together, we can make a difference.

Council met on September 9, at 7:30 pm to review reports and conduct new business.


Fawn Slonka and Shirley Waclo will represent First Lutheran as voting members at the Allegheny Synod assembly this October.

fancy is expected. Just a light refreshment while we gather with our First Lutheran family and friends.





The run-out programs are financed by a grant from the 1889 Foundation.


