A message from Pastor Christy...

"Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. " (Matthew 4:1-2)

This month often feels like a quiet bridge - we're standing in between seasons. Winter is still hanging on, but we know spring is coming.

In the church, February feels much the same. This month, we are invited into that in-between space of preparation as we turn our attention toward Lent. Lent – the season that invites us to slow down, spend time in prayer and reflection. It is a time that gently calls us back to what matters most and reminds us of God's presence and grace in our everyday lives.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, when we hear these words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." These words aren't meant to weigh us down, but to remind us of the good news: that even in our dust, God meets us with mercy, forgiveness, and new life in Christ.

I hope you'll join us for our Ash Wednesday services at both First Lutheran and Benscreek Lutheran. Service times are: 12:30 pm at Benscreek Lutheran and 7:00 pm at First Lutheran. As we all continue this journey, my prayer for each of you is that this February will be a time of reflection, trust, and hope as we prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter.

SHARING RECIPES...

Brownie Trifle – Jenny Cruickshank
13 x 9 pan of prepared brownie mix (according to instructions. Cool)
Small box of instant chocolate pudding
½ cup water
14 oz. can sweetened condensed milk
2 tubs whipped topping
½ bag toffee chips (or other candy bars – crushed, shaved chocolate, or M & M's)

Prepare brownie mix according to directions and cool completely.

Mix the pudding mix, ½ cup water and sweetened condensed milk until combined.

Fold in one container of whipped topping.

Layer brownies, ½ chocolate mousse, ½ second container of whipped topping.

Sprinkle ¼ of the candy of choice.

Repeat the layers and top with remaining candy. Refrigerate until serving.

Council met on January 14, 2026, at 7:00 pm to review reports and conduct new business.

The Audit Committee conducted an audit of the 2025 accounts and found no discrepancies; the accounts were balanced.

Bishop-elect Kevin Shock has suggested that the Synod purchase the garments and items needed for his installation, with the plan to use them again for future installations. He has requested contributions from congregations for these expenses. In the past, each bishop kept these items themselves. The Council agreed to donate money collected over the years in their 'council box,' which was originally meant to cover the annual council dinner. As there have been no dinners recently, the \$553 collected will now be donated to the Allegheny Synod for this purpose.

February Community Outreach

In February we will be collecting items for the UPJ Food Pantry. The Pitt-Johnstown Provides Food Pantry is open to students who may be struggling with food insecurity.

The Pantry accepts the following:

Cans of tuna, cans of chicken, canned stews, canned chili, hash, pork and beans, soups, spaghetti sauce, kidney beans, and jars of peanut butter.

Canned Vegetables: carrots, peas, tomatoes, corn, and boxes of instant potatoes.

Fruits: canned fruits, fruit cups, dried fruits, jelly, raisins, juice boxes, rice, pasta, macaroni and cheese, crackers, cans of ravioli/spaghetti O's, hamburger helper, boxed meals.

Boxes of cereal, instant oatmeal (individual packets), cereal bars, pancake mix, syrup, pop tarts, muffin mix.

Snacks such as tortilla chips, salsa, pringles, cookies, granola bars, microwave popcorn, easy mac, microwaveable non-frozen meals.
