A message from Vicar Christy...



²¹ She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." (Matthew 1:21)

As we enter the season of Advent, we step into a time set aside for waiting, watching, and preparing. Advent is not simply the countdown to Christmas; it is an invitation to pause amid life's busyness and make space for hope. It marks the beginning of the Christian year – a fresh start rooted in expectation and promise.

During this season of preparation- Advent is more than checking off our to-do lists and tidying our homes. It is the quiet work of preparing our hearts. Advent calls us to slow down enough to notice:

- where we need healing,
- where we long for peace,
- and where God might be inviting us to begin again.

Lighting the candles of the Advent wreath – one for each week – helps us move intentionally toward the light of Christ, allowing hope, peace, joy, and love to illuminate our daily lives and to share this with others along the way!!

And the blue color appears in our sanctuary during Advent: blue paraments on the altar, blue stoles, blue banners, and the blue candles of the Advent wreath. This shift in color is purposeful and meaningful.

Blue, traditionally associated with the night sky just before dawn, symbolizes hopeful expectation. It is the color of waiting for that first light to break through darkness. It reminds us that Advent is not a season of mourning but a season of anticipation, a season full of promise. Blue also reflects stability and faithfulness, pointing us toward God's enduring presence as we wait for Christ's coming.

So here is your invitation...as these weeks unfold, consider how *you* might prepare:

- Set aside a few quiet minutes each day for reflection and prayer.
- Practice small acts of kindness to bring light into someone's darkness.
- Notice where God's hope is already working in your life.

And may this Advent season be a gentle guide, drawing you into a deeper relationship with God. And as the color blue surrounds us, may it remind you of the hope before us – where the first light of Christmas is already beginning to rise.


I'M OVERWHELMED

ORGAN PROJECT UPDATE

The Organ Console Returns

On a blustery Tuesday in late November the Skinner organ returned to Johnstown from its restoration

vacation in Cumberland,

Maryland. Electrical connections need to be completed, but the plan is to have organ music for the First Sunday in Advent.

Mark Steiner of the Steiner-Murphy Organ Company has a strong appreciation of our instrument and the builder E.M. Skinner. He is considerate of the work that has been done over the century and desires to maintain the original intentions of the organ builder. In addition to the electronic updating of the console, Mark and Kim have discussed a few tonal changes that will restore some elements of the organ to its 1922 vintage sounds. The organ with 100 memory settings will allow any organist to make registration changes with ease and reliability. The console will look basically the same except for a new array of drawknobs and coupler switches. The general pistons have been increased from six to twelve.

We anxiously await the organ's return. Kim



Tuesday Noon Recital Task Force has elected Kim Rauch as its chair.

Kim founded the series nearly 35 years ago when he was Minister of Music here at First Lutheran. He recently returned to First in late 2022.

Kim said, "I am amazed that a seedling of an idea has weathered over the years. It is pleasure to see the recitals so well attended recently."

Other officers are Fawn Slonka, assistant chair; Vicki Price, secretary; and William Price, treasurer. The former task force chair, George Fattman, will continue to serve in marketing the series and applying for grants.

The task force presents twelve Tuesday noon recitals a year, each followed by lunch. The next program will be on April 7, when Vox Nova, the Mt. Aloysius College Chorale, will return. Most of the recitals are repeated at area personal care homes. This special outreach is underwritten by a grant from the 1889 Foundation, which had been part of Conemaugh Valley Memorial Hospital before it was sold to Duke-Lifepoint.

The recitals and lunches are offered without charge. Donations and grants cover all costs.

Caryl Swanson and Greer Koeller head the volunteers who plan, prepare and serve the lunch.

Following 45 plus years of ministry as your Learning Ministry Associate and the many other hats the title wore; there were also the years I was a volunteer before joining the staff. All wonderful years filled with so many opportunities and memories. It was during these times that I was constantly supported by children, youth, parents, adults and others in all that we did. Following these 45 years I feel it is time for me to retire from my staff position as Learning Ministry Associate. My retirement will be effective January 1, 2026. This was not an easy decision to make for me. But the recent years my ability to function physically and more recently my illness and complete life change, among other factors led to my decision, I believe the time is right.

I have no idea how just saying thank you is enough to truly express my feelings and gratitude; but it seems like the best I can offer. It was a life changing experience. My faith has grown by leaps and bounds serving in this role. I am proud that I was able to nurture children and youth to be worship leaders in our congregation, many who still serve as adults here at First and in the congregations they now support. Thank you for leading me and supporting me in this ministry opportunity. My ministry has been supported by people who served as mentors to my Christian growth and my growth as a church leader. I was blessed to have Dr.

Walden Holl as one of my Confirmation teachers, what a wonderful way to start my faith journey as a youth! Pastor Swanson was a significant mentor in my journey, he encouraged me, supported me, "redirected" me if I was not doing the right things or making the wrong turns! But he was always there for me. I believe that it is because of him and God's plan for me that I became the person I am. There were many other adults and pastors who supported me in my journey, as I think about it now too many to mention in this letter.
